Prepare in advance:

Review quotes for appropriate use with your audience. Consider their reading ability, since it would be embarrassing to encourage reading among those for whom the vocabulary below is difficult. You may want to give them the opportunity to put their quote back in and select another – that ensures that they do not have to read a quote that is too difficult to wade through.

Print the following quotes in large font size. Cut each one along the dotted line so they are in individual strips. There are many ways to use these, and you will likely think of creative opportunities!

Alternatively, encourage young people to come up with their own quotes.

Activity:

As a group, stand in a circle. Pass around a basket or other container and ask each young person to pull out a quote, reading their quote out loud to the rest of the group as they do. Once all the quotes have been read, tape them up on the wall somewhere prominently in the room.




